1. Authorship Responsibility, Criteria, and Contributions.

Each author should meet all criteria below (A, B, and C) and should indicate general and specific contributions by reading criteria A, B, and C and checking the appropriate boxes.

___ A. I certify that

- The manuscript represents valid work and that neither this manuscript nor one with substantially similar content under my authorship has been published or is being considered for publication elsewhere, except as described in an attachment; and
- if requested, I will provide the data or will cooperate fully in obtaining and providing the data on which the manuscript is based for examination by the editors or their assignees; and
- for papers with more than 1 author, I agree to allow the corresponding author to serve as the primary correspondent with the editorial office, to review the edited typescript and proof, and to make decisions regarding release of information in the manuscript to the media, federal agencies, or both; or, if I am the only author, I will be the corresponding author and agree to serve in the roles described above.

2. Copyright Transfer Agreement.

The undersigned author hereby assigns, conveys, and otherwise transfers all rights, title, interest, and copyright ownership in said work to the AHA effective upon acceptance of said work for publication. "Work" includes the material submitted for publication and any other related material submitted to the AHA.

The assignment of rights to the AHA includes but is not expressly limited to rights to edit, publish, reproduce, distribute copies, prepare derivative works, include in indexes or search databases in print, electronic, or other media, whether or not in use at the time of execution of this agreement, and claim copyright in said work throughout the world for the full duration of the copyright and any renewals or extensions thereof.

All accepted works become the property of the AHA and may not be published elsewhere without prior written permission from the AHA. Authors may use parts of the work (e.g., tables, figures) in subsequent works without requesting permission from the AHA.

For Works created under grant from a funding body and accepted for publication in an AHA journal on or after May 2, 2005, the author may cause the posting of the "Accepted Version" of the Work on the web-based archive of a funding body responsible for the funding in whole or part of the Work, provided that the posting is no sooner than 6 months after publication of the Work in an AHA journal and that the archive is publicly available via the World Wide Web in a noncommercial manner. The "Accepted Version" is the accepted version of the paper including changes resulting from peer review but prior to AHA's copyediting and production. "No sooner than 6 months after publication of the Work in an AHA journal" means at least 6 months after the first appearance of the Work either on the AHA journal's web site as a publish ahead-of-print article or on the AHA journal's web site published as part of a regular issue, whichever occurs first.

Authors hereby represent and warrant that they are sole authors of the work, that all authors have participated in and agree with the content and conclusions of the work, and that the work is original and does not infringe upon any copyright, proprietary, or personal right of any third party, and that no part of it nor any work based on substantially similar data has been submitted to another journal for publication.

In the event that the AHA does not publish said work, authors will be so notified and all rights assigned hereunder will revert to authors.

If a joint work, all co-authors must transfer rights in said work to the AHA by executing this Agreement.

This Agreement must be executed as is without revision or substitution of terms. An original handwritten signature of the author is required.

This Agreement is governed by the laws of the United States.
